Hi, I'm an alcoholic and an addict. I am 26 years old. I "quit" drinking when I turned 21 without a support system after nearly a decade of long, lonely nights with a bottle. I was hospitalized recently because I have a diagnosis of Bipolar and found solace in the AA meetings at the hospital. At one of the meetings I was gifted a copy of, The little Red Book. I read the entire thing during my stay. I don't know if I am late or early to the "AA party" but I joined a home group and am learning what sobriety means with the help of a wonderful and wise sponsor. To me, a sponsor is like a mentor or a professor, an approachable non-professional who knows more than you and should be treated with respect. Since I joined AA I have found an amazing community of able people who are willing to make a better life for themselves and others. For that I am grateful.

Every day I wake up and ask God for the gift of sobriety, just for today. I've been doing it for almost 42 years, and He's never failed me. Then I put on my **Suit of Armor**. I'm an alcoholic and heading into a dangerous world. "Are you kidding?" you might ask. Well, I don't literally wear Armor, especially not in Florida – too hot! My suit of Armor is the knowledge I learned from thousands of fellow travelers whom I have listened to at meetings and heard testify to this absolute truth. I cannot drink Alcohol. If I were to drink today, I would soon experience the phenomenon of craving. I'd shift into a state of mind that says, "Yeah, sure I'll have one more." From that mental obsession there is no escape, there is just one more. AA has worked for me. I brought my experience as a drunk, read the books and listened to all of you. Soon I was listening to myself. AA says these ideas must become "marrowized." They must become a part of our innermost being. When that happened for me, I had my daily armor. I got it by growing through the steps and asking for God's help. Lee M., Jump Start

I thought I would drink until he day I died and hoped that day would come sooner rather than later. I read the Big Book in jail and had a White Light spiritual experience. Then, I knew I was an alcoholic, that I was addicted to my behaviors and that I needed a drastic change! Later the thought came that I could manage to drink wine on the weekends with my meals. Alcoholism is just like that. Once I got a sponsor and consistently met with him, started taking action and working the steps, my life began to change. I realized, this is what I'd been looking for in the bottle, but never found. People in Alcoholics Anonymous are truly my brothers and sisters. I can lean on them and help them. In my 4th step, I saw I was the victimizer rather than the victim. What a perspective change! Talking to my loving and tolerant sponsor, a huge weight lifted off my shoulders. My sponsor and others in AA said that it was the obsession being removed from me. God as I understand Him did for me what I could not do for myself. I learned to communicate with my Higher Power, that I can get help with all my problems and be of help to others (inside and outside of AA), and to be passionate about life. Working the 4th step with my sponsor has given me the ability to examine my weaknesses that contributed to my drug and alcohol addiction. It has given me a better understanding as to who I truly am and where I've lost touch with reality. I am the common denominator in most of my resentments. I accept that today. Losing everything including my child and myself, I was sick and tired of being sick and tired. My family was dying of this disease, and I wanted to break the chain. My higher power is my father, friend, way-maker. My higher power is God who is patient and forgiving. He is the ONE who never leaves me behind. As I continue to work the steps my thinking patterns are changing. I have hope. I have faith.
